Oregon University System 2008 Freshman Profile Report

OUS has released the Entering Freshman Profile for the high school graduating class of 2008. <http://www.ous.edu/dept/ir/reports/hsprofile/>

The Entering Freshman Profile is created for each Oregon high school, public or private, to provide information about student performance at Oregon University System (OUS) institutions. The profile looks at students who graduated from an Oregon high school and attended an OUS institution as first-time freshmen (FTF) during the subsequent academic year. The report includes information on where students are going in OUS, how they performed in high school, and how well they did in their first year at OUS.

This year there have been several enhancements, including five-year trend data on enrollment and persistence; district- and state-level reports; and curricular reports for schools sending electronic IDTS transcripts for 2008 graduates.
