

## Oregon Data Project Technical Training Completed

The Oregon DATA Project's round of technical training sessions has concluded, with nine of the "Building a Culture of Data Quality" workshops held around the state. The one-day sessions, conducted by technical training coordinator Ron Hoppes, provided attendees with a model for data quality that they could customize to fit their district's needs.

In all, about 265 people representing more than 100 school districts attended the sessions. Attendees included staff from all the ESDs in the state, as well as participants from ODE, a school board, and a community college.

"This was one of the best trainings, which is difficult to say because all the other DATA Project trainings I've done were excellent as well," said one participant. "For me, this helped connect the instructional side with the more technical side. I feel I have more of a plan, a conviction, a vision on how to move forward."
